A. Consider these placenames:

1. Jerilderie
2. Cootamundra
3. Gobondery (Tullamore district)
4. Coradgery
5. Mulyandry (now Mylandra) (Grenfell district)
6. Goobothery (Tullibigeal district)
7. Bindogundra, Bindogandri
8. Narrandera
9. Mullion (Creek: Wellington district; Yass district)
10. Mungery
11. Bulgandramine

Mark a vertical line through the word separating a possible ending.

<i>garraay</i>	sand, sandhill	
<i>guba, gubang</i>	Cooba, Coobah, Native Willow; hickory tree	
<i>guudhamang</i>	turtle (perhaps striped)	
<i>malyan</i>	eaglehawk	
<i>mayiny</i>	people, person	
<i>muwin</i>	black swampy soil	
<i>ngarran</i>	hungry	
<i>ngarrang,</i> <i>nharrang</i>	frill-necked lizard

Jerilderie 'a reedy place' Henry Withers in Smyth III,219

Jereeldrie 'place of reeds' JFH Mitchell p23 = SM 8.4,15

Jerildery from *jee-reel' – ther'ree* 'place of reeds'
